



Fun Hair Facts



#1:

The average person has 100,000 – 150,000 strands of hair. Each hair strand has its own muscle, nerve and blood supply.

#2:

Black is the most common hair color and red is the most rare and only exists in about 1 percent of the world's population, with blonde hair found in 2 percent.





#3:

Each hair normally
grows about 1 cm
per month.



#4:

A single hair has
a lifespan of about
five years.

#5:

The overall chemical composition of hair is 45 % carbon, 28 % oxygen, 15 % nitrogen, 7 % hydrogen and 5 % sulphur. The hair shaft is essentially composed of keratin.





#6:

A wet strand of hair can stretch up to 30 % of its normal length.
